## History of the Boys and Girls Club in Kingston & Area

Since 1992, the Boys and Girls Club has expanded rapidly from a small group of 300 members to an extensive network that provides valuable services and programs to over 1700 members throughout Kingston & Area.

To support this great venture for kids, the Boys & Girls Club organizes many successful fundraising events, to which the community has responded very well. Because annual campaigns fluctuate, which affect programs run by the Club, the Endowment Fund was established in 1999.

Currently the Boys & Girls Club is trying to expand this fund until its investments can yield a significant annual amount to support the Club's vital programs and services.

## How does the Endowment Fund work?

What makes a donation to the Endowment Fund unique is the fact that your gift will never be depleted. When you give to the Boys and Girls Club Endowment Fund, your gift, combined with all other gifts, will grow, which is vital in helping with many of the programs established for children and youth who come to the Boys and Girls Club of Kingston & Area.

The interest will be used, but your gift will be left untouched and will continue to accumulate interest every year. In other words, your gift will be one that continues to give long after you have made your contribution.

## Bequests



A Bequest is a gift that is embedded in a Will that donates a specific amount or percentage of your estate upon passing away.

A Bequest has major tax benefits. For instance, the entire value of your Bequest is eligible as an income tax charitable deduction in the year of death. While receiving these

tax benefits you are also preparing a momentous gift for children and youth.

## Annual Memorial Donations

When you make Annual Memorial Donations, you create the opportunity to make a significant contribution to the Boys and Girls Club Endowment Fund over an extended period of time while commemorating a loved one.

The gift of Annual Memorial Donations allows the donor to make the gift in their name, or in remembrance of a loved one or friend.

## Life Insurance Policy

If you desire to make a large contribution, but currently do not have the means to do so, a gift through life insurance may be the best way for you.

The Life Insurance Policy is a model form for giving that allows a donor to support the Endowment Fund in a way that might not be possible by any other method.

With a gift of life insurance there are several benefits presented to you the donor, including tax-deductible receipts for premiums paid. Life insurance extends the ability to extend your personal influence outside of your lifetime; and, has the advantage of allowing you to provide your gift now, rather than waiting to make your gift from built up assets.

## Annuities

A charitable gift annuity will provide you with an additional fixed income for life.

In exchange for your gift, you will receive a fixed annual income, that you or another beneficiary can receive, some of it being exempt from certain income taxes.

## Trusts

Similar to an annuity, a charitable remainder trust will provide you with additional income as well as delivering a significant gift to the Boys and Girls Club.



In exchange for irrecoverable transferred assets, you or other beneficiaries will receive income payments annually. Upon passing away, the remainder will then be given to the Boys and Girls Club.
